**NOTICE TO CALL FOR AN ADDITIONAL COUNCIL MEETING**

**MEETING DETAILS:**

Date: Tuesday, 10 September, 2024; Time: 2:00 pm

Place: Council Office, Welsford Street, Shepparton, Mode: Hybrid

**The Business to be transacted at the Additional Council Meeting:**

The Council to resolve to:

1. Acknowledge that sections of the Greater Shepparton community are deeply impacted and grieving due to the human rights abuse of Palestinians.
2. Write a letter to the Federal Government to take the following actions:
  - a. Condemn the indiscriminate bombing and attacks on hospitals, schools and refugee shelters that have resulted in the killing of thousands of civilians, including women and children, in Gaza.
  - b. Advocate for all Palestinian and Israeli hostages to be released.
  - c. Call for an immediate, unconditional and permanent ceasefire and an end to incursions onto Palestinian land.
  - d. Recognise the State of Palestine
  - e. Call for Israel to comply with its obligations under international law
  - f. Call for the immediate lifting of the siege on Gaza to allow Palestinians in Gaza to have unlimited access to food, water, fuel, electricity, medical supplies and construction materials to repair damaged homes and civilian infrastructure.
  - g. Increase funding to UNRWA (United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East) and contribute generously to UNRWA's calls for emergency funding.

**The reason why the business to be transacted at the Additional Council Meeting cannot be left to be considered at the next Scheduled Council Meeting**

The next Scheduled Council Meeting is during the election period, and the Election Policy prohibits certain decisions. There is a risk that the decision on the above matter may fall under the election period prohibited decisions. The Additional Council Meeting is to mitigate this risk.


