3 Governance Principles

Council considers that the decisions contained in these Minutes gives effect to the overarching governance principles stated in Section 9(2) of the *Local Government Act* 2020. These principles are as follows:

- 1. Council decisions are to be made and actions taken in accordance with the relevant law;
- 2. priority is to be given to achieving the best outcomes for the municipal community, including future generations;
- 3. the economic, social and environmental sustainability of the municipal district, including mitigation and planning for climate change risks, is to be promoted;
- 4. the municipal community is to be engaged in strategic planning and strategic decision making;
- 5. innovation and continuous improvement is to be pursued;
- 6. collaboration with other Councils and Governments and statutory bodies is to be sought;
- 7. the ongoing financial viability of the Council is to be ensured;
- 8. regional, state and national plans and policies are to be taken into account in strategic planning and decision making;
- 9. the transparency of Council decisions, actions and information is to be ensured.

6 Corporate Services Directorate

6.1 Conflict in Gaza

Moved by Cr Abdullah Seconded by Cr Adem

The Council to resolve to:

- 1. Acknowledge that sections of the Greater Shepparton community are deeply impacted and grieving due to the human rights abuse of Palestinians.
- 2. Write a letter to the Federal Government to take the following actions:
 - a. Condemn the indiscriminate bombing and attacks on hospitals, schools and refugee shelters that have resulted in the killing of thousands of civilians, including women and children, in Gaza.
 - b. Advocate for all Palestinian and Israeli hostages to be released.
 - c. Call for an immediate, unconditional and permanent ceasefire and an end to incursions onto Palestinian land.
 - d. Recognise the State of Palestine.
 - e. Call for Israel to comply with its obligations under international law.
 - f. Call for the immediate lifting of the siege on Gaza to allow Palestinians in Gaza to have unlimited access to food, water, fuel, electricity, medical supplies and construction materials to repair damaged homes and civilian infrastructure.
 - g. Increase funding to UNRWA (United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East) and contribute generously to UNRWA's calls for emergency funding.

Cr Brophy gave notice of a foreshadowed motion.

The motion was put and lost.

Cr Spinks called for a Division.

Those voting in favour of the motion: Cr Abdullah, Cr Spinks, Cr Adem.

Those abstained from voting: Cr Sali, Cr Brophy, Cr Ladson, Cr Dobson,
Cr Summer.

The motion was lost.

Moved by Cr Brophy Seconded by Cr Summer

That the Greater Shepparton City Council:

- 1. Acknowledge that sections of the Greater Shepparton community are deeply impacted due to events taking place in Gaza and Israel.
- 2. Note the Prime Minister of Australia's joint statement issued on 26th July 2024 that calls for an immediate ceasefire.

The motion was put and carried.

Cr Ladson called for a Division.

Those voting in favour of the motion: Cr Sali, Cr Brophy, Cr Ladson, Cr Dobson, Cr Summer, Cr Spinks, Cr Adem.

Those voting against the motion: Cr Abdullah.

The motion was carried.
